Responsibilities Prior to Hands-On Session

Online NRP 8th Edition Course:

- 1. Follow the link to go to the NRP 8th Ed Learning Platform. Login to the NRP 8th Ed Learning Platform. If you do not have an account, you will need to click "Register Now." If creating an account, you will be sent an email to activate the account and log in.
- 2. Enroll into the NRP 8th Edition Advanced Provider Curriculum
 - a. Complete the course provided through AAP. A separate fee is paid through the organization.
 - b. The NRP 8th Edition <u>Advanced</u> Provider Curriculum must be completed within 90 days of purchase, and within 90 days of the hands-on simulation course.

Instructor-led Event (Hands-On Session) Registration
